


From the Principal

Recent Highlights

The Ohio Academy of Science selected Bishop Leibold School as one of 48 schools to receive The 2011 Governor's Thomas Edison Award for Excellence in STEM Education. The awards recognizes the variety of sciences activities offered, and how well the Academy's definition of STEM education was met.

Our school is one of the few area elementaries offering weekly K-8 STEM classes. The STEM lessons are specifically designed to promote inquiry, critical thinking, and problem solving, and to advance careers in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math.

Iowa Achievement Test Scores indicate Bishop Leibold students average in the top quartile of national norms for academic and cognitive ability.

Teacher Melissa Cox was among 20 area educators selected as Dayton Regional STEM Center Fellows.

Our First Lego League Robotics Team qualified for State Competition in the team's inaugural year.

The 60-member Rosary Club completed and sent 1,000 rosaries to our sister school, Our Lady of Nazareth in Nairobi, and to armed forces members.

BLS 8th Grade students performed above the national Catholic 8th Grade average in "Catechism of the Catholic Church" on the Assessment of Catholic Religious Education (ACRE) Test.

J. Arwine, M. Borchers, A. Muqtadir, N. Noll and N. Walusis were awarded Cindy Beyerle Scholarships, established in her loving memory by her many friends and family.

An Innovative Teaching Grant was presented to our teacher B. Allaire. Mac Grants were awarded to B Allaire, B. Cornett, & L. Schommer. A. Bale was awarded an Ohio Div. of Wildlife WILD School Site grant.

Bishop Leibold Student Achievements

Nearly 3,200 Christian service hours were performed by our 2011 graduates for graduation preparation.

In total, our 2011 graduates were awarded \$23,972 in high school scholarships.

The majority of the 2011 graduates of our Spanish Language Program placed into Spanish II as they began freshman year at Catholic high schools.

24 Junior High Science Fair contestants advanced to Regional Competition, and three BLS students advanced to the 62nd Annual State Science Day.

Joecelyn Meyer was awarded a renewable Taylor Family Scholarship from Alter High School for performance on the High School Placement Test.

Laney Hartman and Ben Goubeaux were awarded Pope John Paul II Character Awards, high school scholarships funded by the BLS Athletic Asso.

BLS Graduates Anne Monnin and Brian Walsh were awarded the Pat Hein Scholarship as were 7th Graders Sarah Junker and Adam Lachey.

Laney Hartman was awarded The Charles J. Lanasa Scholarship, established in memory of this beloved and dedicated BLS principal (from 1994 to 2001).

Madison Hartings and Laney Hartman received The Alter High School Council Leadership Award.

The Fenwick High School Krusling Merit Scholarship was given to Abbey Monsour.

The Knights of Columbus awards were given to Connor Cottongim (Maria Manning Scholarship), Brian Walsh (Excellence in Religion Award) and Amber Browning (Religion Scholarship).

Six BLS students received The K of C Serra Award for dedicated parish service. Nearly 90 of our students are involved in Choir, Server and Lector parish ministries.
